

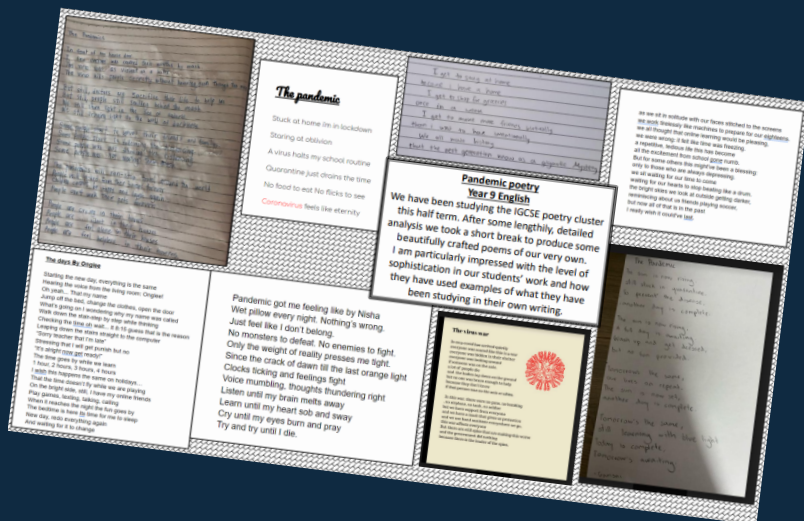


SIH NEWS UPDATE

FROM THE SIH TEAM

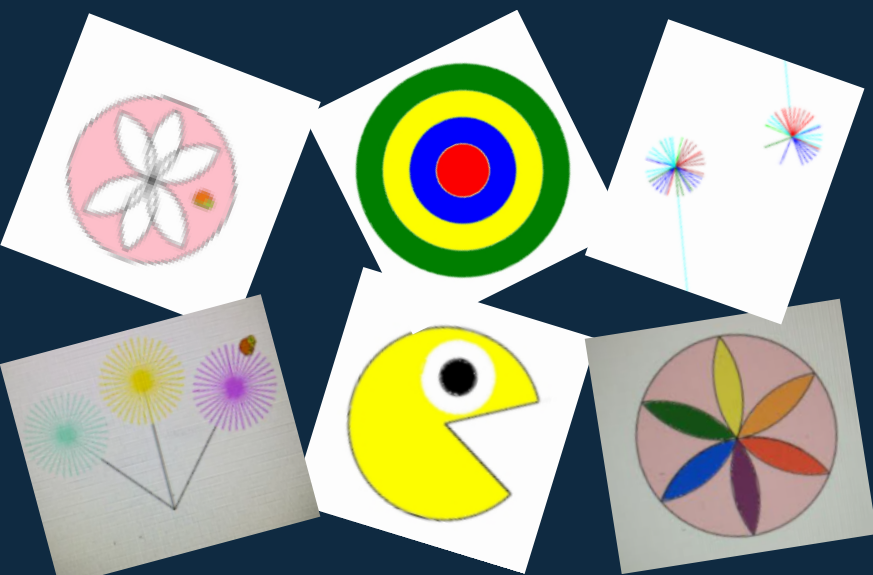
Year 9 - English

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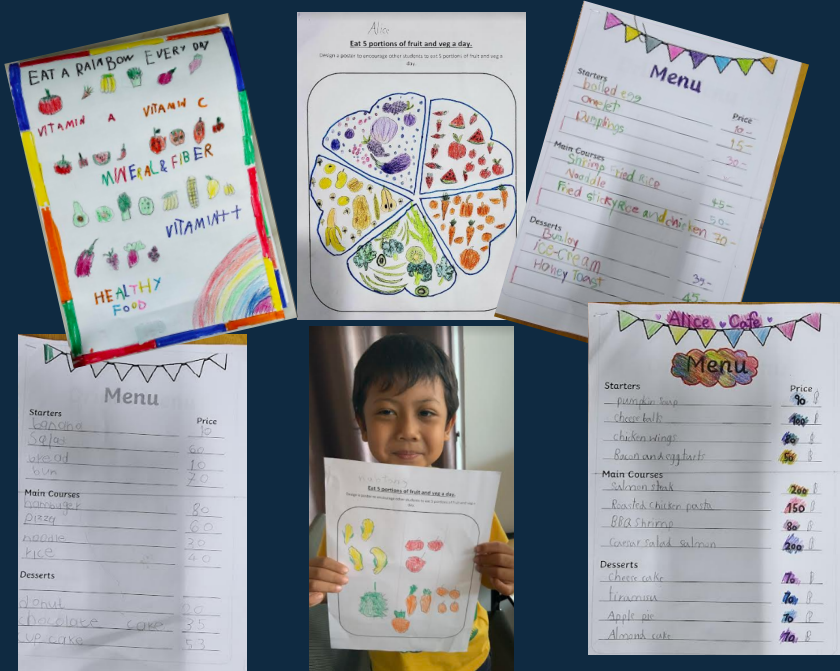
Year 7 - Flat Stanley Project

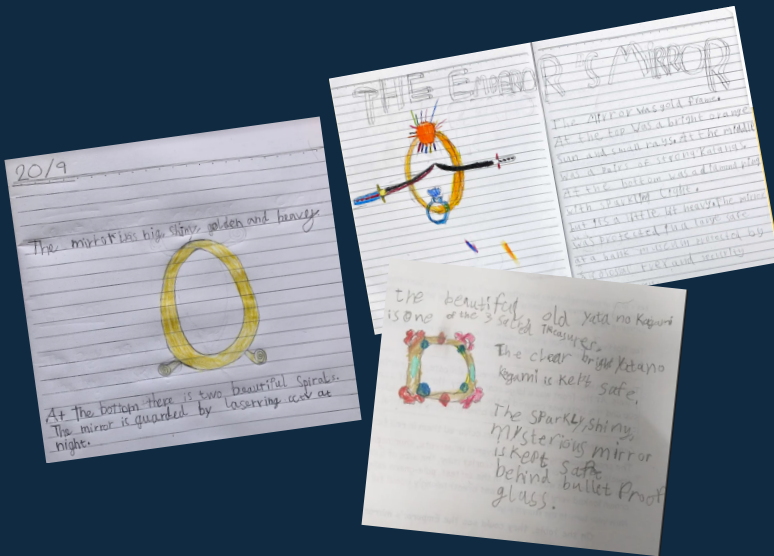


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Year 4- English
