In year 3 we have started a new book called 'The worst witch'. We had a go at drawing our own spooky witches and we are pleased with how they look!





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
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International Day of the Dot

Well done to all our Secondary students who created their own dots to celebrate their uniqueness. We encourage you all to make your mark and see where it takes you!




Year 9 - History

KG2


